# Minister's Message

*"The mission of Covenant Presbyterian Church is to encourage a diverse worship family that is representative of our past and embraces our future."*

## *Where the joy is*



In Ecclesiastes - this title means "Teacher" - 3: 12 the author, the Teacher of that book, writes: "I know that there is nothing better for them than to be happy and enjoy themselves as long as they live."

As continuation of the famous "For everything there is a season, and a time for

every matter under heaven" section in 3: 1-8, the Teacher asks us, the readers, to accept that it is a God-given task to enjoy the good, both in play and at work. Moreover, that it is God's gift that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all our toil.

This month I am writing about the last E of Encouragement: Enjoyment. (see note). It's not always easy to enjoy. We tend to have a hard time doing that. When we go on a vacation, it takes time to adjust, to relax and enjoy, because we are so much in the grip of stress and pressure. After all the hard preparation and planning and the astronomical expectations created, we sometimes have a hard time enjoying our own wedding. We might be so involved in the nitty-gritty of church (commission) work that we can lose the perspective on all the miracles God is doing right around and through us.

Ecclesiastes reminds us that God calls us to enjoy. We are asked to see the hand and face of God at work in people, in church, in nature, and in life, and find pleasure in it. We are invited to affirm God's love by finding things pleasing. Step back, relax and enjoy!

In church we can find enjoyment by affirming the positives. Helping others make things happen. Trusting in God. Acknowledging in word and deed that we are all Children of God. Come and see what God is doing for a new thing! "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice." (Philippians 4:4). It is my dream that pretty soon in our Mission Statement at Covenant we dare to change the word "encourage" to "enjoy": "We **enjoy** a diverse worship family."

# Session Notes



At its May 17 meeting,  
the Session:

- ▶ Voted to put reminders of the need to contribute to the Faith and Growth Fund in church bulletins and newsletters after Treasurer Mickey Reilly reported that the fund is lagging, with \$535 needed each week and \$2,320 each month to meet the \$27,837.96 indebtedness from 2010.

- ▶ Learned that Elder Jeff Lippincott and Rev. van der Werff have been appointed to the administrative commission in charge of dissolving Bethany Presbyterian Church, a process that will take until July 1, 2011, and that Rev. van der Werff has been appointed moderator of the Bethany Session.

- ▶ The Rev. van der Werff requested that e-mails be sent to the person directly who could most accurately answer the question presented. He reiterated that he counsels persons up to three times and then refers to them to an appropriate specialist, i.e. a therapist, spiritual director, counselor, etc.

- ▶ Learned that Rev. van der Werff is in communication with Rev. Elizabeth Vandegrift of Ewing Presbyterian Church about the future of our joined youth ministry.

- ▶ Learned that an informational meeting about the past, present and future of our youth program will be held on Sunday, June 5, after coffee hour, with youth, parents, leaders and others interested and invested in the program invited to attend.

- ▶ Learned that Rev. Nancy Schluter, who has been working with the ID program, is working with a committee to reach out to the Hispanic community, and especially to women who work as maids and to those in service, with special hours established to accommodate their schedules.

- ▶ Learned that the church calendar will be put on Covenant's website and that commissions can send a request to a staff person to include activities on the calendar.
- ▶ Heard a report from Rev. Schluter on the recent decision by the PC (USA) that leaders of the church will be reviewed on the basis of each candidate's calling, gifts, preparation and suitability for the responsibilities of ordination, rather than on sexual orientation or marital status.
- ▶ Learned that Sharon Young and five other church members will attend the Big Tent 2011 conference in Indianapolis June 30-July 2.
- ▶ Heard from Mickey Reilly that the Building and Grounds Commission is hopeful that the water problem in the basement is now solved. Additional repairs and materials are being supplied by the company at no charge.
- ▶ Heard from the Congregational Life and Fellowship Commission that the Tea by the Sea went well, with a net profit of \$2,300, and that Tina Lamb will chair the church picnic and Harriette Williams will chair the Strawberry Festival.
- ▶ Heard from the Christian Education Commission that the youth mission trip to West Virginia will take place at the end of July.
- ▶ Heard from the Worship and Music Commission that the next Healing and Wholeness service will take place at 6 p.m. Wednesday, June 8, after which monthly services will resume in the fall.

*Wednesday, June 15, 7 pm*

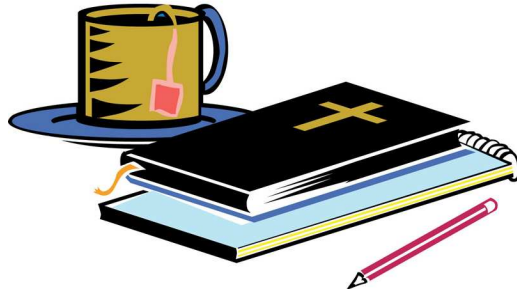
Covenant's women's group, the Circle of Sisters, will meet in the lounge. The topic for May is "Why do we really need to respect each other?"

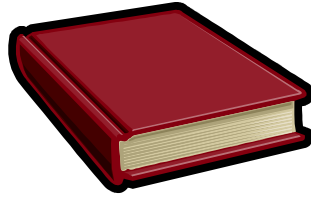

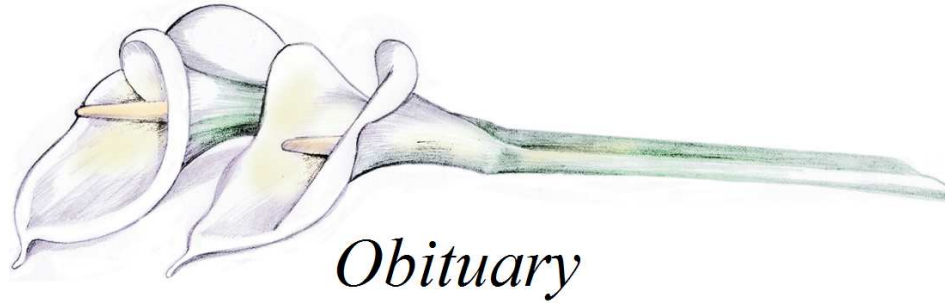
## Covenant and Ewing Picnic Together!

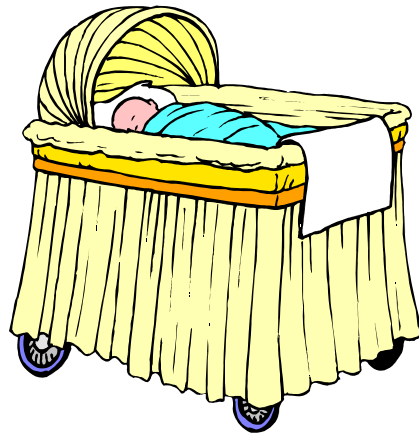
If you will not be in church that Sunday and would like to contribute grocery items, leave your groceries at the church office marked "Food for Friends," and we'll see that they are included in the collection.
